What is DUAL ENROLLMENT?

A program that enables you to:

- Take college courses – no tuition & limited fees.
- Save hundreds of dollars in education expenses.
- Register for up to 2 courses per term at EFSC. (In some cases 3 classes.)
- Earn high school & college-level credit at the same time.
- Attend daytime and/or evening classes at EFSC.
- Experience college early – Finish sooner.
- Create the educational program that's best for you!



How does dual enrolling in EFSC classes impact your high school schedule?

- ✓ PCCA will allow you to take up to 2 classes a semester, 3 in some cases.
- ✓ Sample Schedule: 2 EFSC classes and 5 classes daily at the high school.
- ✓ Graduate high school with up to 24 hours of college credit.
- ✓ Your high school schedule will be adjusted to balance your high school and EFSC classes.



Benefits of Dual Enrollment

BENEFITS

- ➔ Get a head start on college – no tuition and lab fees!
- ➔ Earn high school and college credit at the same time!
- ➔ Experience the academic challenge of college courses now!
- ➔ Develop the skills needed for college success!
- ➔ Save hundreds of dollars in college costs!



Risks of Dual Enrollment

RISKS

- ➔ Poor grades can impact graduation, college admission, your college acceptance & scholarships.
- ➔ Poor grades remain on your college record & high school transcript.



Dual Enrollment Course Weighting

- Dual enrollment courses weighted the same as AP when calculating the weighted high school GPA.
- State universities weight dual enrollment courses in the core academic areas the same as AP, IB and AICE when calculating the high school GPA used for admission decisions.



Some Differences Between High School and College

WEEKLY CLASS SCHEDULE

Typical EFSC face-to-face campus class schedule:

- Meets 1-2 times per week – MORE work outside class. EFSC does not have classes on Friday. (Monday and Wednesday or Tuesday and Thursday).
- Courses 1 semester in length = 3 credit hours (sometimes 4 or 5).

EFSC ATTENDANCE POLICY

- Students expected to attend each class session.
- Attendance at 85% of sessions required for credit.
- Instructor may have a stricter policy – Check Syllabus!
- Arriving late or leaving early can count as absence.



FERPA – Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act

High school students taking EFSC campus classes can:

- 1) Review their educational records
- 2) Maintain some control over who can access their records
- 3) Seek to amend their educational record

Parents of dual enrollment students may NOT:

- 1) Contact their student's instructors
- 2) Attend student/instructor conferences without permission
- 3) Access the student's coursework in CANVAS
- 4) Use the student's college email to contact instructors.

For questions, parents should contact school counselor.



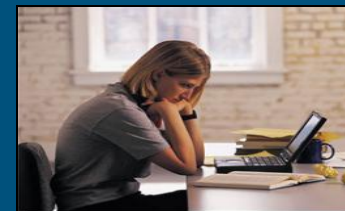
IMPACT OF EXCESSIVE ABSENCES

- You must log into classes and submit assignments on a regular basis in Canvas. If you do not submit assignments in a one to two week period, you will be withdrawn from the course.
- Most classes have a no LATE work policy. Work submitted past the deadline is a ZERO.
- Loss of dual enrollment eligibility for one term!



USE OF TECHNOLOGY IN EFSC CLASSES

- Students MUST:
 - ✓ Have computer and internet access.
 - ✓ Be prepared to use technology in coursework.
- CANVAS, EFSC's Learning Management System
 - ✓ Used in ALL classes this semester.
- **IMPORTANT!** Online CANVAS training should be completed. 1st Week assignments should be completed.



Some Realities about Dual Enrollment

Courses– Developed for adult learners

- ▶ *Students of all ages in the class.*
- ▶ *Class discussions generally NOT censored.*
- ▶ *Coursework NOT modified for age/maturity.*

Level of difficulty

- ▶ *Generally assumes high school completion.*

Study time per week

- ▶ *At least 2 hours of study for one hour in class.*

EFSC and high school calendars differ

- ▶ *Student expected to follow the EFSC calendar.*



Grades in your EFSC Classes

- ▶ *Become part of your college & high school transcripts.*
- ▶ *CAN affect graduation, college admission & scholarships.*
- ▶ *Instructor sets procedure for calculating final grade.*
- ▶ ***Your goal should be an “A” in each EFSC class!***

DONT FORGET! *Your senior year counts! A drop in your EFSC grades may result in a university rescinding your acceptance.*



Planning your EFSC schedule – Think ahead!

- **What are your high school activities?**

Schedule your EFSC classes at times that don't conflict with practice, games or performances.

NOTE! High school activities are NOT excused absences from EFSC classes!

- **Do you have a part-time job?**

Set your priorities – Make sure you have the time to succeed in your college work. Poor grades can impact your future plans!



Creating a college schedule that works for you!

PCCA factors...

- Face to face classes must be taken at Palm Bay Campus.
- Scholars are excused for one period at PCCA for each class at EFSC.
- Online classes are recommended.
- How many credit hours can you handle well?
- Traditional face-to face, Online or Hybrid class?

Maximum of 7 classes per semester

Course Enrollment Information

- Students must meet minimum requirements for all EFSC course enrollment.
- Courses must be approved by PCCA prior to enrollment at EFSC.
- All English high school graduation requirements must be taken at PCCA.
 - Credit earned in COM classes can be taken for elective credit.
- Courses in Math and Science may be taken at EFSC for high school graduation requirements.
- All classes must be approved by PCCA before enrolling at EFSC.
- Specific questions regarding course enrollment and credits should be directed to Ms. Moravecky.

PCCA Eligibility Requirements

What is required for Dual Enrollment Admissions?



Cumulative Grade Point Average

- ❖ PCCA requires a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.25.
 - This includes ALL high school credit earning classes, including those taken in Middle School.
- ❖ Confirm that you have the minimum cumulative GPA.
 - Ask Ms. Moravecky if you are unsure.



College Ready Placement Scores

- Appropriate college ready test scores as indicated by EFSC requirements.
 - Minimum PERT Score
 - 103 Writing
 - 106 Reading
 - 123 Math
 - SAT Subscores
 - 24 Reading
 - 25 Writing and Language



How do you schedule the test?

- ❖ PERT Placement Test must be taken on the EFSC Campus.
 - Melbourne or Cocoa Campus
 - Testing is Monday - Thursday 9:00 am -1:45 pm
- ❖ YOU MUST PRE-SCHEDULE A TESTING TIME ONLINE.

 - MUST HAVE PHOTO ID to test
 - You must bring a copy of your results back to Ms. Moravecky
 - Test results will also excuse your absence.



TESTING NOTES

- For purposes of Dual Enrollment, High School students will be permitted one placement test administration at no cost during a calendar year (12 month time period).
- You may retest up to two times per subtest during a 12 month period of time with a minimum of 30 days between test administrations for a payment of \$10 retest fee per subtest.
- In the event that the 2nd retest attempt does not qualify as college ready, they must wait 12 months from the initial test date to retake the placement test without cost.



NOTES

- Once you have a college ready placement score, you will meet with Ms. Moravecky to submit your EFSC application.
- Once accepted to EFSC, you will attend an Orientation and pick classes for the fall term.



DEADLINES

- Scholars must have a passing college ready score and application on file to EFSC by June 1, 2022.

**Keep in mind if you do not have college ready scores on PERT, you must wait 30 days to retest. If you don't get a minimum score a 2nd time, you must wait 12 months to retest.

- Initial PERT Test must be taken by April 8, 2022.
